#### FREE whole-school co-curricular activities in Week 1!

Without any cost to students, in the first week of next term, we are providing two excellent programs for all students. Starting on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October, we will have 'Healthy Harold' visiting the school in the much-loved Life Education van. Students in K-2 classes will visit the van for 1 hour while students in Years 3-6 will enjoy a 90-minute session. There is no permission note for this activity as it is part of the regular Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) curriculum. Students will be involved in the following programs:



Kindergarten - *My Body Matters*: This module focuses on things children can do to keep themselves healthy including healthy food choices, the importance of physical activity and safety.

Stage 1 - *Safety Rules:* This module helps children to problem solve, learn about personal safety in different environments, seeking help, how to care for others and talk about behaviours that maintain friendships.

Stage 2 - *All Systems Go:* Students explore and discover how magnificent the human body really is. They learn the functions of various body parts and the actions required to keep these systems working well.

Stage 3 - *Relate, Respect, Connect:* Teaches the knowledge, skills and attitudes that children need to develop and maintain safe and respectful relationships both on and offline, including effective communication skills, development of empathy and conflict resolution skills.

Also in the first week back, on Wednesday afternoon from 1.40pm, the entire school will enjoy a free anti-bullying show. The *Backflips Against Bullying* show will utilise performers' incredible acrobatic skills to captivate and engage audiences, in order to spotlight important issues that children face when it comes to bullying. The show itself is a hilarious, fun, and interactive experience – it features awe-inspiring tricks & flips from the performers and interactive scenes that depict the different forms of bullying. Students are empowered to be effective bystanders, with the ability to take action against bullying and victimising,




