## Principal's Message

### Welcome Back!

Welcome back to all of our families for what promises to be another excellent year at The Meadows Public School in 2019. I especially extend a very warm welcome to any new families who have joined us for the first time. I am incredibly proud of the way in which all of our new students have settled in this year. We have formed 11 classes with 242 students in total. As I have already informed parents of our Stage 3 students, we are a just a few new enrolments and a short time away from being able to form a 12<sup>th</sup> class to reduce the larger than average class sizes we currently have in Years 5 and 6. Stay tuned!

Our Kindergarten students have been simply outstanding in their first 7 school days and the new enrolments across Years 1-6 have also settled in extremely well. This is due to the combined effort of supportive, positive parents and teachers and our caring student body. I credit you all for a smooth start to the year. Our students are eager to learn and we look forward to a year of tremendous growth in all areas.

### 2019 Classes

That's just the class teachers! In future newsletters this term, I will provide some photos and some information about our support staff and administration staff. We are one big team and it's good to get to know all of our staff as many teachers and other staff members play a key role in the day-to-day care and education of your children.

### Sports in Schools Australia (SISA)

Thank you to the parents and carers who have already completed their full \$20 payment for the Sport In Schools Australia (SISA) program for 2019. The program features 18 fortnightly lessons of 50 minutes duration across the year with focus areas including athletics, gymnastics, sports skills and social skill / teamwork development. The cost for the full year is just \$20 – that's half the cost of the fees charged in 2018. The students in Years 3-6 enjoyed their first session last Monday and our students in K-2 classes are eager for their sessions to commence next Monday, 11<sup>th</sup> February. If you have misplaced your permission notes for this program, please send your child to the office to collect another. Payments are due by Monday, 18<sup>th</sup> February.

### School Drop-offs / School Pick-ups

If you travel by car to and from school for drop-offs and pick-ups, please ensure to follow the road rules. A number of parents have been seen to be allowing their children to exit their cars at the pedestrian crossing. I have been made aware that parking rangers have been in Fuller and Carrington Streets this week and that a number of parents will be unfortunately receiving fine notices for illegal parking and dropping off of passengers in unsafe situations.

Parents and carers are also requested to enter the school via the main pedestrian entrances at the Fuller and Carrington Street gates, rather than entering the carpark and already busy office area. Thank you in advance for your understanding. We always act in the best interests of the safety of your children.

### Student Mobile Phones

In the 21<sup>st</sup> century world we live in, there are many advantages to the technology that surrounds us. However, due to the inappropriate use of such technology by a small minority, technology provides society with plenty of problems too! Every school I've been attached to in the past decade has had incidences of inappropriate use of mobile phones by students. It is my preference that students in Primary School don't have mobile phones. However, I respect the opinions of all parents and carers and accept the need for some students to bring phones to school if they walk considerable distances without adult carers to and from school.

If your child is in such a situation, has their own mobile phone, and it is brought to school, it is an expectation that the phone is handed in to either the front office, or preferably, your child's class teacher. Students whose phones have not been handed in after morning roll call

will face disciplinary action and parents will be contacted to make arrangements for the collection of phones.

### School Maintenance

Following on from the extensive painting which took place around the school last year, we have received news of some major works to take place beginning as soon as next Friday, 15<sup>th</sup> February. The roofing above the following buildings will be completely replaced: 5/6H, 3/4J, 3/4H, 5/6D, 3/4B and 3-6L classrooms; school counsellor's offices; school canteen.

Each class mentioned will need to be out of their own classrooms for approximately a week at a time. Thankfully, we have some vacant rooms to accommodate these students during this time. The entire project, weather-permitting, should be completed before the end of term.

The second large maintenance project involves our multi-purpose games court on our playground behind the library block. The majority of the court is currently cordoned off as it presents as a health and safety concern due to the major undulations and cracks in the court's surface. The court will be dug up and completely resurfaced in soft-fall material complete with multi-sport line markings and sets of reversible basketball / netball posts with backboards and rings. Unfortunately, 4 large trees which have caused the damage will need to be removed. Smaller trees with smaller root systems will be planted in their place. The project should be completed by the beginning of Term 2.

### P&C Meeting

Our Parents & Citizens (P&C) team meet on the second Tuesday of every month. This means our first meeting for 2019 is next Tuesday, 12<sup>th</sup> February at 9:00am. Our first meeting will be held in the Staff Room in our main office block. Our P&C has increased in membership in the past 3 years, peaking at 25 members for one meeting last year! But we can always get bigger and better! The P&C is YOUR opportunity to help guide some of the decisions of the school. We normally meet for about an hour and there's always coffee, tea and some tasty treats too! Please come and join us for our first meeting for the year next Tuesday morning.

### Student Leaders Induction Assembly

Parents and carers of our 2019 student leaders have been sent invitations to our **Student Leaders Induction Assembly on Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> February**, commencing in our school hall at 2:00pm. Overall, 18 young leaders will be inducted into their leadership roles: School Captain, Vice Captain, 2 Prefects, 4 House Captains, 4 House Vice Captains and 6 SRC Representatives. These students and their families have also been invited to join us for a short afternoon tea in the Heritage Room at 2:30pm.

## Meet The Teacher

A note will be sent home on our regular note day next Tuesday regarding **Meet the Teacher** evening. This event will take place on **Wednesday, 20<sup>th</sup> February**. Each classroom will be open for half an hour with each teacher giving a presentation and providing key information about this year's programs and procedures. As outlined on the note, K-2 classes will have Meet the Teacher sessions at 5:00pm, Years 3-4 classes and 3-6L will meet at 5:30pm and Years 5-6 classes will meet at 6:00pm.

There will also be a **free** sausage sizzle operating next to the canteen between 4:45-6:45pm. A range of drinks will be sold at the stall. Parents are urged to return their invitation notes by Monday, 18<sup>th</sup> February to allow for accurate catering to take place. Thanks in advance!

## Uniform Shop

Our Uniform Shop is linked to our school canteen and therefore is only open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:20am. The canteen closes at 1:50pm each day. The office will no longer be selling uniforms except for the case of new students who start school on a 'non-canteen' day. Thank you for your understanding of these arrangements.

## Attendance / Lateness

School attendance and punctuality to school are once again targeted areas for school improvement in 2019. If your child is absent from school, please ensure you provide a note explaining the absence upon your child's return. Parents and carers who fail to do so will be issued with an Unexplained Absence note to return to school.

Additionally, if your child is late to school without an explanation, your child will be issued a note informing you of the unexplained late arrival to school. Let's work together to make a difference this year. "In line, on time, at 10 to 9!"

If your child has not received an excursion note due to being absent, please see your child's class teacher as they should have any notes that were not initially handed out.

**No change** - no change will be given at the front office. As a school we bank daily, consequently we do not have change.

## CREATIVE ARTS
