Principal's Report

COVID-19 Impacts - What's on and what's changed?

There is still no change regarding the rules about parents being asked to remain off-site on a day-to-day basis.

However, guidelines for schools have been updated today with the scope to invite a 'Covid-safe' number of attendees to our end of year Presentation Day Awards and Year 6 Graduation Assemblies. More advice will be provided in the coming weeks. We are certainly all hoping to return to our regular operations with parents allowed on site daily in 2021.

Tell Them From Me Survey

A HUGE thank you to those parents and carers who responded to requests and completed the 2020 Tell Them From Me Parent Survey. In 2019, we had 39 respondents and that number has increased significantly to 71 parents completing the survey this year between September 15th and October 23rd.

The findings from parents are particularly positive. For the second year in a row, our parent community's responses have been more positively scored than the NSW average for ALL SEVEN aspects of the survey. Parents have indicated they feel welcome, they feel the school is inclusive, they see safety is a priority of the school, our parents are informed, they support learning at home, they believe the school supports learning and they believe the school supports positive behaviour. There are still areas for improvement and development, and these will be responded to in our 2021-2024 School Improvement Plan.

Punctuality to School

Usually, when records are broken, there is a reason to applaud and celebrate. But not last week. In my time as Principal, since March 2016, attendance and punctuality data has been collected weekly. Last week a very concerning record was broken with 151 students recorded as late for school across the 5-day period. That's an average of just over 30 late students every day. That is simply not acceptable for a school of our size.

For security reasons, particularly during this time of the pandemic, our gates are locked promptly at 8:50am each morning. The expectation is to be at school BY 8:50am. Our gates are open with teachers on supervision duty from 8:20am each morning.

I thank those families who continually abide by the school expectations of arriving inside the gates by 8:50am each and every day. Your efforts throughout the year are appreciated. The vast majority of late students are arriving between 8:51-9:00am. For the majority of late students, it shouldn't be hard to make a minor adjustment at home to the morning routine, enabling an on-time arrival EVERY day.

Yes, I have high expectations, and yes, a minute late is still late. We are endeavouring to create successful habits for all of our students and excellent standards to live by, setting up future success.

Late students miss vital early instructions, impact the functioning of the front office and can be disruptive to students already in class.

Please be considerate of these expectations and endeavour to have your child or children arrive IN LINE, ON TIME at 10 to 9 every day. Thanking you in advance for your cooperation.

School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> on new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>re-apply or update their details</u>.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>elioibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to ://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateE

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.
