Principal's Message

Resilient Students and Teachers, adapting to change!

A number of classroom teachers have been taking leave periods of varying length in Term 3 and indeed one class has had a change of teachers for the remainder of the year.

Miss Yagci and Mr Lambeth return from leave next Monday after three weeks of overseas travel. Thank you to Mrs Nina El Mourad for teaching KY across this period and also to Mr Andrew Kim for replacing Mr Lambeth for the majority of his absence. The students in KY and 3-6L are to be commended for their adaptability at this time.

Adding to the staffing changes, due to unforeseen circumstances, the previous teacher of 1/2A, Miss Jess Forde, had to return home to live in Adelaide and is therefore no longer able to teach at The Meadows Public School. In acknowledging the disruption to the class in Semester 1, rather than bringing in an unknown casual teacher, we opted to staff the class utilising permanent, experienced teachers who are known to the students and bring teaching knowledge and expertise to the role.

1/2A are being taught by three different teachers; Mrs Katherine McKnight (English), myself (Maths & Sport) and Ms Greta van Wyk (Science & Geography). We are certainly enjoying our time with this resilient group of students. On a personal note, it has been invigorating to return to the classroom and see the joy in our students' learning.

School Uniform

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Attendance and Arriving on Time

Starting on the first day of this month, each day when class rolls are marked, whenever a child is marked with an unexplained absence their parents will receive an automated text message from our school's SENTRAL Attendance System. This message will be sent at Midday.

Please reply to these texts with an explanation for your child's absence. This will save you the need for sending in a note to explain the absence! Finally, please ensure we have your correct mobile phone contact details.

In additional attendance-related news, it is disappointing to report that across the first two full weeks of Term 3, we have tallied 122 students who have arrived late to school.

The second week of this term saw 75 students arrive late to school at a very disappointing average of 15 late students per day!

Students miss vital instructions in those first 5-10 minutes of each day and lateness in the primary school years is certainly habit-forming. Conversely, arriving on time each day and even having some social time on the playground each morning allows the child to settle into their school day in a calm, non-rushed manner. Please remember, "In line, on time at 10 to 9!"

Encouraging Positive Attitudes Towards Learning

Dads, you have an important role to play in your child's education. Not only have fathers been shown to have a significant impact on academic achievement, but your child's attitude towards learning and school is also very strongly influenced by you. So, if you show and encourage a love of learning, you will be setting your child up for success throughout their lives.



Top Tips for Dads

- Take an interest in what your child is doing at school. Ask them about their day at school "What was the best thing about school today?".
 "What did you learn at school today?". Ask their thoughts and opinions about new topics they are learning about.
- Be positive about school. Even if you have some not so positive memories of school or learning yourself, allow your child to create their own experiences of school. Speak positively about going to school and learning.
- Talk about learning. Talk about your experiences
 of learning new things and how it has helped you
 in your work and life. Try learning something new
 together build something, learn about something
 new about the world online, play general
 knowledge games and quizzes with the family.

- Make contact with their teachers. Children notice when their dad actively communicates with their teacher/s. This makes them feel that you are really interested in and connected to them.
- Take an interest in your child's homework and assignments. Ask them what they are doing for homework and if they would like to discuss it with you or could show you what they are doing.
- Praise their efforts. Encouragement from dad goes a long way. Tell your child how proud you are of them when they try hard and have a positive attitude toward learning. You could reward by doing something together they enjoy.



Wellbeing Check

Did you know that how we 'think' affects how we 'feel' - not the other way around. So, if you notice you are having negative thoughts, you have the opportunity to challenge that way of thinking and decide if this is helpful for you and your child.
