

A bit of School History......



With the Department of Education celebrating 175 years of Public Education in NSW, I found this week an opportune time to share some of our own 133-year history with our students, teachers, and visitors at our Open Day Assembly. Here's some of the key historical points I've discovered!

- Our school opened 133 years ago on Monday, 3rd November 1890 with 15 students, increasing to 34 by the end of the year. We now have 287 students. At one time, in 1970, we had 779 students!
- Why did a new school even begin? Local farmers who grew orange orchards didn't want to travel so far to school. The 4 local schools were Prospect, Seven Hills (on what is now the Seven Hills North site), Blacktown (which no longer exists) and Toongabbie PS. Local orchard owner on Fuller Street, Mr Wakely, gained the signatures of 14 residents and applied for a school to be built.
- The first teacher and Principal was Mr Henry Chandler. He was just 22.



The first school building in 1890 was made of wood. That building was replaced in 1898 with one made of bricks rather than timber to prevent termite damage. The new building, which 5/6R now proudly call their classroom, came at a cost of 310 pounds or \$620. It was extended to double its length in 1928 and the Block F we see outside has been standing in that form for 95 years!

- Our longest-serving Principal was Mr Charles Sattler. He spent 24 years in charge from 1905-1929. He used a horse and cart to get to and from school along the dirt tracks of the time. His horse named Sultan would be tied up on the school fence. Sometimes Sultan would escape, and the school leaders were given permission to leave the school to chase Sultan up the dirt roads!
- One boy in Mr Sattler's class was allowed to fall asleep in class each day because he had woken each morning before the sun came up to milk the family cows. It certainly was a very different, simpler time back then!

Paying for Uniforms ONLINE

To make a payment for uniforms simply logon to the new SchoolBytes portal via the school's website.

Logon to SchoolBytes on a Computer or Phone (you can save it as a favourite on your screen).

Go to your **Statement of Account** via the menu or Quick Links.

Scroll to the bottom of the page.

On a Laptop/Desktop "Add Other Item".

On a mobile device use the + button.

If you have more than one child, you will need to select one, then select "Uniform" from the available options and ADD ITEM.

Calculate how much your order comes to using a Uniform Order Form (available at the Office or on our website) and add the amount you need to pay. Then pay as usual using your credit card.

If your account with the school is in <u>CREDIT</u>, you will be given the option to use some or all of it. Write your receipt number on a Uniform Order Form and give it to the canteen to collect your uniform.

If there are other items outstanding on your account and you do not wish to pay them at the same time as the uniform payment, you will need to untick them

before you make the payment.




3/4P


Look at all the outdoor play equipment that our SRC has purchased with the money raised at school!


