### Principal's Message

### **Morning Routine**

I have been extremely impressed with the improved rate of punctuality to school in 2023. Only a few years ago, we averaged 25 late students per day. In 2023, we have reduced that figure to just 7 late students per day.



We would love to achieve as close to 100% of students on time as possible. Every minute counts, especially during the periods of key instruction in classrooms each morning. Please ensure your child is 'In line, on time, at 10 to 9!"

Additionally, we ask that all parents and carers aid the morning transition of students, particularly those in K-2, by either dropping off at the gates or escorting to the K-2 COLA and then moving off as soon as possible to reduce the possibility of any separation anxiety. A quick goodbye is the key to developing confidence and independence in every child!

### **School of Opportunity!**



Our students have been blessed with so many opportunities since our last edition of The Meadows Mag. Our Stage 2 students enjoyed their first overnight excursion experience when they attended 'ZooSnooz' at Sydney's Taronga Zoo a few weeks ago. At the same time, our support class students enjoyed a day trip to Calmsley Hill City Farm, and just last week our Stage 3 students really enjoyed a threeday / two-night adventure in the nation's capital, Canberra. The Canberra excursion featured a myriad of varied locations to explore and learn from, including visits to Parliament House, the Australian War Memorial, the Australian Institute of Sport, the Geoscience Centre, The Deep Space Station at Tidbinbilla, the Dinosaur Museum, the Electoral Education Centre and Questacon. The constant through all of these experiences has been the feedback our teachers have received from staff at the various locations regarding the respectful behaviour our students have demonstrated. They have been an absolute credit to our school and their families. A big thank you to Mr Haynes, Miss Simmons, Mrs El-Mourad, Mrs Quince, Miss Phan, Mrs Regan and Mr Lambeth for attending these overnight excursions in support of these

opportunities for our students. Their level of care to provide a safe and secure home away from home is second to none.

The other key opportunity for our students was our recent participation in the Blacktown Festival of Performing Arts. We were very well represented by our Years 3-6 Dance Group as well as our Choir with all students lighting up the stage, performing brilliantly on the night. A big thank you to Mrs Jeloudev and Mrs Ozel (Dance) and Mrs Germolus (Choir) for their coordination of these performing arts opportunities for our talented students.



### **Zone Athletics Carnival**

26 students represented TMPS at this week's Zone Athletics Carnival at the Blacktown International Sports Park. All 26 are to be commended for their achievements in qualifying for this event and for their efforts and sportsmanship on the day. Thank you to Mr Duckworth for managing our team and to all of the parents and carers who were able to support our students and assist with transport on the day.

The most amazing individual achievement was that of Hadizatu who won the 100m sprint final for 10 year old girls! Hadi will now go on to represent Seven Hills / Wentworthville Zone at the Sydney West Regional Athletics Championships next term on Thursday, 12th October. Quite remarkably, Hadi absolutely blitzed her 100-metre time from our school athletics carnival, where she finished in 18.35 seconds. In her heat at Zone, she achieved a time of 15.59 seconds and bettered that again to record 15.41 seconds in the final!
