

#### **Multicultural Day**

Our next big whole-day whole-school event is Multicultural Day, set down for next Wednesday 20th September in the final week

of term. An invitation note was sent home on Wednesday with full details. The country of birth register for our 290 students at TMPS includes 16 different nations and we will be celebrating the multicultural nature of our Meadows Family on this day.

This is a MUFTI Day, and all students are encouraged to wear the colours of their nation of origin.

The full program includes:

9:10am - Multicultural Day Welcome Assembly. School Hall.

9:30-12:40 - Multicultural Learning Experiences "World Tour"

12:40 -1:40 - Lunch, a Multicultural Banquet!

We will have food stalls set up in the Hall and 3-6 playground area with the following cultures represented: Aboriginal, Afghanistan, Australia, East Africa (Kenya /Uganda), Eritrea, Germany, India, Iran, Lebanon & Palestine, NZ Maori, Pakistan, Tonga and Turkey. All food items will range in price from 50 cents to \$2.

Lunchtime will also feature a number of cultural dance performances from some students and parents.

Some of the delicacies on offer include, but are certainly not limited to fried beef, lamingtons, ANZAC cookies, chicken schnitzel, potato salad, German cheesecake, gingerbread, chicken pide, spinach pide, baklava, kebabs, chicken and vegetable biryani, tabouli, hummus, meat pizza, island donuts and bacon and egg pies!

Try one, try all! None of the food items will be pre-ordered, it will all be sold directly on the day. We would encourage each student to bring \$5 - \$10 to enjoy a wide variety of foods from a wide variety of nations!

We would love to see you all for what promises to be a celebration of the rich cultural diversity we have at The Meadows!

As of today, we have already surpassed 50 Kindergarten enrolments for 2024. This is a record number in my time as Principal for this stage of Term 3. Our anticipated enrolment number for 2024 across K-6 is 319. This number would most likely allow 15 classes next year compared to the 14 we currently hold.

After dinner, we explored the Australian Dinosaur Museum by torchlight.
