Principal's Message

Kindergarten (and Stage 1) Independence!

As we approach the end of Term 1, we are aiming to foster as much independence in our 2025 Kindergarten students as possible. To aid the smooth transition into class each morning, we are asking those parents of K-2 students who enter school grounds in the morning to say goodbye to your child at the edge of the K-2 covered COLA area (as pictured) and leave your child to independently play with friends or walk to their class lines. Please remember, 8.47-8.50am, during the morning bell music, is not an appropriate time to speak with teachers. If you would like to speak with your child's teacher, an appointment can be via the office. Thank arranged vou for understanding and support of this initiative to encourage a greater level of independence for our K-2 students, in particular, those wonderful little people in Kinder!



Parent / Teacher Interviews

We did some investigations on measurement and learnt about some formal units to measure length (metres, centimetres and millimetres)



One of our School Captains, Aaron Rai, has produced this wonderful recount, describing his experience on Tuesday at National Young Leaders Day. Enjoy the read!

Dear Diary,

What a day to remember! Today was absolutely remarkable—an adventure brimming with excitement and unforgettable moments, and I can't wait to capture it all right here.

It all began with my friends from the leadership team and me hopping onto a van, ready to head to the ICC Sydney for the Halogen Young Leaders Day. I was buzzing with excitement and anticipation for what lay ahead but made a point to stay composed and focused for the day!

We arrived at the venue just before 8:00 am and the buzz in the air was contagious. The excitement in me grew as we waited to enter the building. Around us, waves of student leaders from a diverse range of schools across the state stood, just as eager to begin this incredible day.

When the doors finally swung open, we stepped into the massive theatre that would be our base for the event. And when I say massive, I mean—it was enormous beyond belief! Our seats were right at the front, directly in front of the stage, where all the inspiring speakers would take the spotlight.

The event kicked off with the lively host energizing the crowd as we waited for all the schools to settle in. To break the ice, we played a fun game called "Clinker." The goal? Guess the colour of the filling in the chocolate before biting into it. It was a sweet way to start the day, literally.

The first speaker was Catherine Laga'aia, who will star in the upcoming live-action Moana movie in 2026. She shared her journey of resilience—from receiving the opportunity to act, to moving from Australia to Hawaii for the role. Her story was a mix of challenges, triumphs, and plenty of laughs, especially when she casually revealed she once punched Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson in the face (on set, of course)!

After her talk, we had a brief recess before heading back into the theatre for the next speaker.

Thomas-Duncan Watt took the stage next. He's an award-winning Australian screenwriter and playwright. His career began with a love for Star Trek and a homemade show he created with his friend Josh. He shared how his first attempt at filmmaking received harsh criticism but how he turned those failures into stepping stones for improvement. Two metaphors from his speech stood out: "Every master was once a disaster" and "Every failure is one step closer to success." His humour had us all laughing, making his talk as entertaining as it was inspiring.



Following him, we had the honour of hearing from a remarkable 11-time gold medal Olympian who dominated the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. She shared ten profound lessons from her journey to becoming the most decorated Olympic athlete. One that stuck with me was: "You cannot achieve anything alone." Her words ignited a fresh determination in me to work hard and persevere toward my own goals.

After her motivational talk, we took a break for lunch and some playtime in the park. The park was bustling with students from schools far and wide, and it was fun mingling and playing with people from so many different places from the state.

Finally, the day wrapped up with Anthony Harries Carroll, a globally renowned lifeguard. He talked about the risks and responsibilities of his role, often working alone in high-stakes situations. He recounted life-saving experiences and even included a light-hearted moment where his son and a friend demonstrated CPR—he cheekily tried to make his son give a kiss, much to everyone's amusement!

In the end, today left an indelible mark on me. I've learned that leadership is more than just a title; it's about the qualities we cultivate within ourselves. And the best part? We all have the potential to lead no cape required.

It was a smooth-sailing, deeply enriching day, and I'm so proud of myself for soaking in every moment and embracing it to the fullest.

I can't wait to see what tomorrow brings!
