Principal's Message

My Final Newsletter!

It is hard to believe that this is now my final newsletter contribution before I step down from my position as Principal of The Meadows Public School, effective Thursday 31 July 2025.



As mentioned in my email on 13th June, this was an extremely difficult decision, and it was made after much personal reflection and consideration, following recent challenges with my personal health. While I have strived to continue leading our school with the dedication you all deserve, I came to realise that to truly prioritise my wellbeing, I needed to take a step back and focus on my health. I thank you for the well wishes I have already received from so many members of our community since sharing this news.

I am incredibly proud of what we have achieved together during my time as Principal for over 9 years, since March 2016, in particular the strong sense of community and very positive sense of belonging we have fostered. I have cherished the opportunity to work alongside such a talented and committed staff, and to witness the incredible growth and spirit of our students.

Our Director Educational Leadership is currently working diligently to appoint a Relieving Principal and we will share more information when it is available. I have every confidence that our dedicated leadership team and staff will continue to uphold the high standards of

education and care that define The Meadows Public School.

I will be forever grateful for the trust you placed in me and for the privilege of serving this wonderful community.

Staffing Changes

Aside from my own move, I have a number of significant staffing changes to report. Thirteen years ago, in Term 2 of 2012, when I held the Deputy Principal role here at TMPS, I had the pleasure of employing an excellent School Learning Support Officer (SLSO – Teacher's Aide) to support students and teachers in a variety of classrooms. The SLSO was named Mrs Wendy Anderson! Over time, Wendy transferred into the office as the School Admin **Officer** for the next decade before more recently taking on the role of Relieving School Admin **Manager** since the retirement of Michelle Harrison. For so many years, Wendy has been the face of TMPS, the first friendly face to greet anyone visiting the office. This is a critical role in any school, and we've been very privileged to have had such a friendly and loyal servant being this 'first face' of the school for such a long time! Mrs Anderson is looking forward to a sea-change, beginning the next chapter of her life on the far north coast of New South Wales! Congratulations on a wonderful contribution to school life at The Meadows!



Additionally, our part-time School Admin Officer, Kerrie Brown is stepping down from her position at the end of this term after 18 months in the role, while our SLSO Toni Cimijotta will vacate her position on 8th August after supporting countless students and teachers in her role since 2019.

A huge thank you from myself on behalf of the entire school community to Wendy, Kerrie and Toni.

With change, there is always someone new! We will formally welcome Mrs Jenny Tucker to the Relieving School Admin Manager role from the start of next term!

Finally, I am pleased to announce that Mr Braydan Pidgeon will remain as the full-time class teacher for 5/6SP until the end of the year.

Student Progress Reports Semester 2 Reports

Each student will receive their Semester 1 Report next Monday 30th June. There is often some confusion around A-E grades used on reports for Years 1-6, however, the following analogy linked to driving can help explain these grades!

A – Outstanding – The grade for Grand Prix racers!






B – High – The grade for advanced drivers with extra skills

C – Sound – The grade for a full driver's licence, like most of us!

D – Basic – The grade for a driver on P plates, driving independently but is still learning.

E – Limited – The grade for a driver on L plates, who needs to be accompanied by an experienced driver.

The other key considerations when reading through your child's report are the **Effort Grades** and the sections towards the end of the report on **Social Development** and **Commitment to Learning**. Ultimately, you are looking for a **top score of 5** for each effort area and a **C for Consistently** rating for each of the Social Development and Commitment to Learning areas.

NAIDOC Day



NAIDOC Day, our celebration of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, will be held next Friday 4th July.

Students will enjoy a range of Aboriginal cultural activities on the day and will enjoy a sausage sizzle and a cupcake for either Recess or Lunch.

There is no cost involved in this event; however, students are encouraged to bring a gold coin donation as this is a Mufti Day. Students are encouraged to wear the colours of the Aboriginal (black, red, yellow) or Torres Strait Islander (blue, green, white) flags.

Attendance News!

At the time of writing, we have **52 students** who have not missed a single minute of Term 2! Indeed, we still have **16 wonderful students** across K-6 who have maintained PERFECT attendance across the whole school year so far with **ZERO absences and ZERO late days!** Congratulations to all! Keep it up! Who can stay 'perfect' until the end?

A target rate of attendance for **EVERY child** is a **minimum attendance rate of 90%**. This only allows for one day of absence every fortnight. While 90% may 'sound' good, a child with a 90% attendance rate will still miss 20 days per school year of 140 days (almost 3 terms of education) across their primary school (K-6) education. Therefore, it is the absolute minimum we expect.

At this point in time, **211 of our 335 students are on target and above 90%**. We need to work collectively to move the 124 students below 90% into the 'on-target' group!

If your child is absent from school, please ensure you provide a note explaining the absence upon your child's return or simply respond to the School Bytes message on your child's day of absence.

Additionally, if your child is late to school without an

explanation, your child will be issued a note informing you of the unexplained late arrival to school. Let's work together to make a difference this year. "In line, on time, at 10 to 9!"

Holidays and Screen Time

As we head into the two-week Winter holiday, I urge all families to have a think about the amount of 'screen time' your child will be allowed to access across the fortnight.

The potential negative effects of excessive screen time include, but are not limited to, childhood obesity, poor social skills and inadequate sleep. Concerns about these potential negative effects have led to recommendations about placing limits on children's screen time. For example, the Australian Government, as part of its physical activity and sedentary behaviour guidelines for children aged 5-12 years recommends that electronic media use for entertainment purposes be **limited to a maximum of 2 hours per day**.

Unfortunately, the 'weekend' average screen-time for a primary school aged child in Australia is 4-5 hours per day with 2-3 hours per weekday. As the school holidays are just like 'a weekend every day' this could mean your child could potentially spend up to 80 hours across the next fortnight looking at a television, an iPad, a computer screen or a mobile phone.



Let's consider some alternatives to get the balance right! Reading, sports and physical activities, family outings, cooking with mum or dad at home, gardening, chores around the home! The list is really endless. What can you put in place at home to reduce screen time to 2 hours per day?

Mission 100' Holiday Reading

I have been so impressed in recent weeks, having read all 335 of our student reports, with the news of very promising and rewarding progress in reading levels across the school. As we enter the winter holiday period, I have issued each student with a personal reading

challenge for the holidays, a challenge known as *Mission 100*.

Your child's mission, should he or she choose to accept it, is to read aloud to a parent, a sibling or other family member for at least 10 minutes a day for 10 days of the holidays, completing a minimum of 100 minutes of face-to-face reading.

Our students need the regular reading to maintain their skill level and to enable all to return in Term 3 ready for even greater levels of improvement.



This newsletter's 'Fun Page' activity is a record-keeping page for your child/children to fill out as they continue their reading journey through the holidays. Just 10 minutes a day, and what a difference this will make for your child! Happy reading girls and boys!



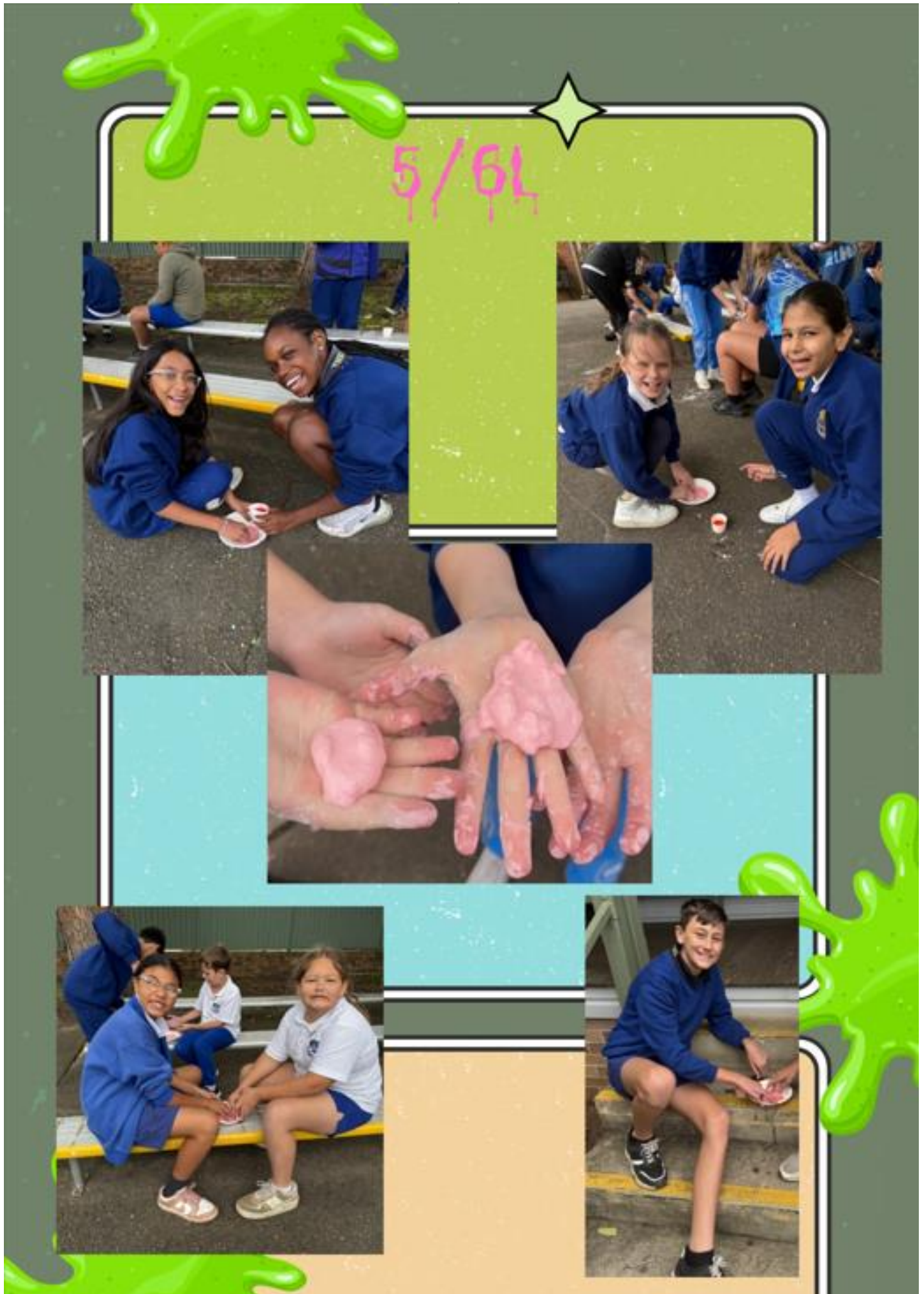

Kindy Speech and Language Screeners

For children facing more complex difficulties, families may be advised to seek further external support with a speech pathologist or have a more thorough communication assessment.
